Summit Trails (which includes a 5 days backpacking trip), was sweet. This year it was a father and 2 of his kids. Mr. Dean and Mr. Keith guided them. What a blessing to invest in families. The Ladies Summit Trails (which is day hikes) were guided by Mrs. Loftus, they were 4 camper ladies, and a volunteer (friend) and I cook suppers for them and went on a couple of their adventures. These August numbers may seem like low numbers. But what wonderful opportunities for one-on-one conversations. There is truly a different feeling on these retreats because of the way that God can guide conversations. Praying God will bless each of these lives that set time apart to hear God's Word and fellowship with each other.

After the Summit Trails, God brought a group of 6 men from the IBBI team. These men have come for 5 years, they are ready to serve and to build for ministries. They are an encouragement and a great help. As they came so did the sheet rockers. This was a hired crew that a man from Colorado paid to come. This was an amazing part of this crew. They were all Hispanic. And God supplied a Christian man who came 4 weeks later to share the Gospel.

Ladies Retreat happened in September. There is always much to be done. We want to serve the ladies that come very nicely and sweetly. Many friendships have come about in these retreats, many hearts shared, ladies saved and encouraged. God brought the help needed that week and it truly was a bless time, ladies were encouraged and the Gospel was heard so many times while focusing that God's Mercies are New Every Morning from "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." Lamentations 3:22-23. We had around 50 ladies. What a sweet encouragement it always is to see God bring the campers and the help to serve them. And what a joy it is to see our children serving the Lord right alongside us. Praise God!

The day that Ladies Retreat ended, we had a team from Greenville, SC come. They were an exciting crew for David. The man who organized the team was David's mentor and friend in the cabinet shop at BJU while David learned and work there. He enjoyed reuniting with old friends and working together here at Red Cliff Bible Camp. One of the men (the painter) was from Colombia, and most of the sheet rockers were from Colombia. God used this man to give a clear presentation of the Gospel to them in their own language and sent Spanish Bibles for them. That was a huge blessing.

Truly Great is the faithfulness of God! A lot of the guys were finish carpenters but, they help work on doors and many things around the lodge, God is so good. For this crew we all served, and cared for them. It was a blessing to serve all together. During halloween we handed out 128 Bible tracts. We pray that those who read it will be reached by the Gospel. Fall is busy for all areas. In the mist of all the work at camp Mr. Keith (program) was gone many times recruiting (please pray for the 2023 summer staff); Mr. Dean (Director) spends lots of hours on the phone or email looking for workgroups, answering questions, making camp paper work happen (He has a lot on His plate); Mrs. MacGill does our finances; David's areas are facilities (new and repairs), utilities, vehicles and the computers; Mrs. Loftus does food service; Stacy works on music (and helps Wixi) and homeschooling; Wixi works on hospitality and homeschooling. We all have lots to do no matter the season. Thank you for praying for all of us. Please add these 2 families volunteers, one that help us with the finances and one that helps with registrations. These 2 ladies do the work in the quiet yet, what a blessing they are for camp.

Lastly, pray for our board members, we got the opportunity this year to meet at camp for 2 days with most of them while they had their meetings. It was a good reminder to pray for them, we are so thankful that they take extra time from their already busy time to help us at camp.
