Thank you for your prayers and support during this time. In our last newsletter we asked you to pray for our winter camps and many other things. Our God in His faithfulness answered so kindly; and truly was our help.

Our amounts of snow were low this year (maybe 3 and half feet of snow) while having very cold temperatures. God supplied just the right amount of help and allowed our speakers, campers, volunteers and staff to attend each of the camps. Retreats went well, to God be the Glory! Cleaning days, couples, and teen retreats had comfortable Wyoming weather; men's retreat was very cold. Yet in all we trust that God guides the weather and each situation. Through the years we have changed dates in order to plan better, yet truly God is the giver of safety and snow amounts among many other things. We praise God many heard the Gospel, were encouraged and challenged in God's Word. Some of our supporters were able to come for the day or the whole retreat which was encouraging and even one of our supporting pastors came for the day. We praise God that many of you not only support us, pray for our family and ministry, come to help; but even come to be part of camp. We do praise God for the opportunity and privilege to serve the Lord here.

Our prayer is that each person who was at camp this winter will grow in the Lord and that God will use His Word to remind them even now of the truths of the Gospel. We thank God for the freedoms we have to serve Him here in the Mountains of Wyoming and We ask you to pray for God's strength and guidance as we seek to serve our Lord and Savior.

We praise God for the many He used to help David transport campers and winter staff. We praise God for safety and for how the facilities functioned well for each retreat even with low temperatures and low levels of snow. God helped us to have the equipment working well and gave safety for each camp and work day.

After retreats David went back to working in the camp facilities. Before camp during January all focus is mostly on having things ready for camp. After that, the focus is on getting buildings ready for summer camp, so most of this last month David's focus has been on starting back on working on the Big Sheep cabin bathrooms. The goal is that those 2 cabins will be ready for summer camp. The guys are working together on this project and also having planning times for summer camps and work crews. When these bathrooms are done, all the main camper cabins will have bathrooms. It is exciting how the boys' cabins will be done soon Lord willing!

During winter retreats Wixi helped with cleaning prior to camp retreats, she cared for our kids and part of the Holt's girls at home each weekend when retreats were going on. God gave safety to them in town and right before Valentine's Day, they were able to hand out 32 Bible tracts. We prayed God may use them. Wixi and the kids continue to work on school. Right now, they are preparing to give out Bible tracts before Easter. We have 72 faux tulips that we are planning to tie with Easter service invitations and a Bible tract. Thank you for praying about these matters.

Here is a family update:

This past Monday, Anah Grace was in the middle school (she is part time there). During her band class she had what may look like a migraine seizure. We really don't know exactly what caused the seizure. We rode the ambulance to our clinic, and after a CT scan and blood tests, they determined that because what they can see there is no major problem going on (like tumor, bleeding or blood clot). By the evening she was back to her normal self. We are waiting for an appointment at Primary Children's Hospital in Salt Lake, UT. She is doing well, we are trusting the Lord and even though this is a new road, we are praying for grace, hope and healing as we walk in faith. Please pray for Anah Grace's mind and body. She is processing a lot. She does not remember what happened, but understands the implications of what happened. We praise God it did not happen during winter camps, or at camp. She did attend teen retreat to help with the different needs, and is trusting the Lord and believes that God has a plan even though we may not understand right now.

As you read this letter, we are on our way to Wolf Mountain Camp. This is the camp where our son Leonard was born. We have not gone back since we became fulltime at Red Cliff. For many years David has attended Tweak-age Camp. He was not able to participate this year. So, he planned last month for us to travel to Wolf Mountain to learn and grow in camp work. Their director is hosting our family. We are all looking forward to it. We have friends in that camp and look forward to grow and learn as we fellowship. We are praying we will be an encouragement to them too.

We discussed if it will be wise to still drive to Northern California. David's mom had a plan to fly into to Salt Lake, UT since she is coming to spend a month with us. David felt like this would help her to adjust and trust the Lord. We also wanted to teach our kids that God will give us grace and guidance in every season. Thank you for praying for our family.
