Summer Camps



Resident Staff Transition


I would ask you to **pray for Keith and Stacy Holt and their family** as they are seeking God's leading for their next opportunity in ministry.

Work Projects Fall & Early Winter

In October the trusses, sheathing, and roof underlayment on the fire suppression tank building were completed. The walk-in cooler/freezer was installed in the main lodge kitchen area, and floor tile was finished up in the main floor bathrooms.



In November the shower tile in the main floor bathrooms, and hallway tile were completed. Insulation and heaters were installed in the fire suppression tank building. Window trim boxes were started in the Welcome Center along with plumbing finish fixtures in the bathrooms and kitchen!

Dear Friends and Supporters,




